Parent Opinion Survey

Preliminary Parent Opinion Survey results have been released and they are very positive. The results consist of very high positive endorsement (agree or strongly agree responses.

Thank you for completing the survey. I have been endeavouring to increase the participation rate over the years to gain an accurate reflection of community perceptions. Pleasingly, participation has increased from 6 families to 9

families, 17 families last year and 23 this year. Being approximately 50% of families. Below is a snapshot of some of the survey results:

Year 3/4 Newsletter Report

It has been a busy fortnight in the 3/4 classroom. We have started a new reading unit on astronomy, where we are reading about the how the Earth and our moon rotate and orbit around the Sun. Over the next fortnight, this will extend to learning about the whole solar system and beyond. The students have been learning why we have seasons, years and eclipses. The class has been using new terminology to be able to describe these processes.

In Writing, the class has been working on persuasive writing. We have previously covered a range of single sentence/paragraph skills and now moved on to writing whole persuasive pieces.

In Maths, we have been conducting different probability investigations to predict and prove the probability of different events. We have also been learning how to convert between different forms of fractions.

Last Tuesday, we had a presenter from the Eureka Centre in Ballarat visit our classroom with resources that supported an interesting lesson about flags. We discussed the difference between icons, emblems and logos. The class then learned about the history and symbols of the various flags we have in Australia, including the Eureka Flag. The Eureka Centre is an interesting museum that explores the impact of the gold rush on Victoria. It is well worth a visit with children and offers free entry to families who live the district with postcodes: 3350-3358.
