

# 3/4 Newsletter Report

It has been a wonderful fortnight of learning in the Year 3/4 classroom. We have continued our reading unit on astronomy, learning about famous astronomers throughout history.

In Science, we created a solar system to scale. In textbooks, the planets are often not shown to scale as Jupiter and Saturn are so much larger than the smaller rocky planets like Mercury and Venus. The class created a scaled model of the solar system which we pegged out in the school grounds. The Sun, with a diameter of 14m, was so large that we just measured it out along the fence line near the staff carpark. We made all the planets to scale, including: Jupiter (diameter = 143cm), Earth (12cm), right down to Venus (2cm). We used a smaller scale to place the planets at their relative distances. Even with Earth at only 7m from the Sun, we couldn't fit Neptune within the school grounds. This activity modelled how unimaginably vast distances are in space.

In Writing, the class has been writing single detailed paragraph responses to a range of different topics. The students have been self-assessing their work from a check-box list to analyse what they are including and where they can improve their writing next.
