#### **Interviews**

#### **Healthy Minds**

This Friday, we had a full curriculum day with Healthy Minds (they work Australia wide and globally). Parent seminars will also be offered.

The staff day included:

- Understanding and Overcoming Anxiety: Having a Healthy Mind
- Creating Healthy Minds
- Seven Secrets to a Healthy Mind
- Building School Connectedness

A little sample of the workshop Understanding and Overcoming Anxiety: Having a Healthy Mind:

- A clear understanding of what anxiety is, where it comes from, and what to do about it.
- The distinction between 'normal' and 'clinical' anxious states.
- 5 things everybody needs to know about anxiety.
- The 'Great Mistake' (the most common obstacle that impedes a robust psychology).
- How 2 core ingredients can overcome anxiety in any individual.
- The fundamental link between overcoming anxiety and building confidence.
- A comprehensive checklist for what teachers can do.
- Tips for creating a classroom culture to reduce the incidence of anxiety in your school.

At this stage, the three parent presentations will include:

- Pathways to a Healthy Mind: The keys to resilience, mental health, and wellbeing from early childhood onwards.
- Seven Secrets to a Healthy Mind.
- Understanding and Overcoming Anxiety in Kids: Having a Healthy Mind.

#### **Professional learning**



From next term, we are fortunate to be able to further enhance our EDI (explicit direct instruction) teaching model through the acquiring the services of educational consultant, Bronwyn Ryrie Jones. Bronwyn is an instructional coach in Responsive Teaching and Explicit Direct Instruction (EDI). Pedagogical approaches already being implemented at our MBPS. We have formed a partnership with two other schools in Ballarat to pool our collective resources and knowledge! Bronwyn will deliver Responsive Teaching Masterclass and five days of coaching and implementation support throughout the year. Also, working in classrooms with teachers to enhance their capacity.



Another example of our commitment to evidence-based best practice at MBPS. The staff and I will be completing a short course in the evenings through Latrobe University. SOLAR, La Trobe's Intermediate Science of Language and Reading short course is designed to support staff to

further develop the necessary skills and knowledge about reading instruction and intervention for all children. The content integrates information from linguistics, cognitive science and neuroscience to derive best practice for reading instruction and intervention with a Multi-Tiered System of Supports (MTSS) framework.

#### **School damage**

Unfortunately, during the school holidays two cars entered the premises and rammed the shed/art room roller door. Vision of the incident was captured on CCTV and passed on to the local police. Nothing was taken from the premises. We are now left with a large bill to replace the roller door.

As of 8:30 am on Monday the 13th of February, we are calling for nominations for school council members. There are three parent positions, and two community positions open for nominations.



### Prep

What a great start to the year the Preps have had!! We spent the first two days of school learning about classroom routines, school rules and good and bad choices. Then we jumped straight into our learning program for Term 1.

In Spelling, we have been learning the letters and sounds 's' and 'a'. We have been learning how to say the sound and how to write the matching letter correctly.

In Writing, we have been practising writing our focus letters using the dotted thirds lines. We have also been practicing writing our name very neatly. We have been discussing sentences and how they need to be a complete thought that makes sense. We have even been finishing some sentence stems with our own ideas.

In Maths, we have been working on writing the numbers 1, 2 and 3. It is very important that Prep students learn to correctly form numbers to 10 in the first term of school. Practise makes permanent, so we want to be practicing correctly!!

Our wellbeing focus has been around how to make friends at school and what things we can do when we encounter problems when playing with our friends. Keep an eye out in the Ballarat Courier and the Creswick District News for our class Prep photo!

We are off to a great start in the Prep classroom and looking forward to lots of learning this term!


