#### Year 4 Newsletter Report

It has been a wonderful fortnight of learning in the Year 4 classroom. We have continued reading our whole class novel, 'Nim's Island'. It is about a resourceful girl who lives on a tropical island surrounded by sea lions, turtles, and a marine iguana. The author, Wendy Orr, uses rich descriptive language, including metaphors and similes for the students to unpack and understand. In Writing, the class has drawn on the ideas within 'Nim's Island' to write a persuasive text about 'How to Survive on a Deserted Island'. Students planned and drafted their writing, with an emphasis on editing. In Maths, the class has been learning to use the subtraction algorithm while practising their skills doing worded problems. We have also been learning how to round numbers to the nearest 10, 100 or 1000 which will underpin learning to estimate in the last week of school.

#### ART

We have been having a great time in the Art shed in Term 1. The junior grades have continued to explore various elements of art using oil pastels, chalk pastels, fine liners and various other materials. They have explored background and foreground, linework, and the filling of space. The Grade 3/4 students and Grade 5/6 students have been working on an art project inspired by the work of Dora Ficher. Dora Ficher uses bold lines and plays with primary and secondary colours in her work, creating texture through shading and layers. The senior students have taken inspiration from Dora Ficher's pen and ink work, creating a grid of imperfect lines which is then used to create a landscape of houses, gardens and sky. The students were required to colour each square of the grid individually and took their time to create their own unique designs. We are looking forward to more wonderful creations in Term 2!



#### CHINESE

In Chinese, our students have explored various aspects of Chinese culture, including Chinese Zodiac Signs, Chinese Paper Cutting and the history of the Gum Loong. Foundation students enjoyed listening to the Chinese New Year stories. They have created the Chinese character 'Loong/dragon' out of playdough, and they also made a dragon puppet to take home this week. Grade 1/2 students put a great deal of effort into learning to write the Chinese character 'Loong'. They also enjoyed naming the 12 Zodiac signs and putting them into the correct order. Senior

students have created a variety of dragon collages and paper-cutting dragons. As part of our Chinese New Year studies, senior students have explored the history of the Begonia Festival and how it became to multicultural event. They understand that the Gum Loong is borne of the combined efforts of the Mt Blowhard, Canadian Lead and Sebastopol Primary Schools and is therefore owned jointly by the past and present students and staff. It was great to see some students coming along and participating in our Gum Loong Parade.



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
